Dear Prevention Certification Candidate,

Thank you for your interest in obtaining the Certified Prevention Professional (CPP) credential. Enclosed you will find the Prevention Specialist Certification Board of Washington (PSCBW) CPP Candidate Portfolio/Application Packet. Please read and follow the directions carefully.

The CPP application process is a two-step process requiring the following:

1. Submission of a complete Candidate Portfolio. This portfolio includes the application with supporting materials, criminal history background check results, signed Code of Ethical Conduct for Prevention Professionals agreement, a photocopy of a current picture identification, and both an application and testing fee. The complete portfolio must be board reviewed and approved before proceeding to the second step.
2. Placement for the written Prevention Credentialing Examination. The candidate must achieve a passing score as established by International Certification and Reciprocity Consortium (IC&RC) to qualify for the CPP credential.

After successful completion of the two-step process, the PSCBW will award the CPP credential to the successful candidate. Certification is valid for two years and must be renewed by the CPP every two years. The renewal process includes submitting a record of continuing education/training with corresponding documentation, an updated criminal history background check, and a renewal fee.
